At Bremer State High School, we are proud to offer a varied curriculum that engages students, which will prepare them for their future success, with a high-class education.

To achieve these education outcomes, we provide many resources to assist students with their learning. The Department of Education (QLD Government), provides funding to support children's education such as instruction (teachers), facilities (schools grounds and buildings) and administration (staff to assist with the running of the school). This does not extend to fund schools for individual student resources such as textbooks, online programs, equipment to assist with education and many items used in the classrooms.

Bremer State High School offers a student resource scheme to parent/carers, to assist them in providing the necessary resources required for their student's schooling. This scheme provides a cost-effective alternative to purchasing textbooks, resources, consumables and materials for families, through reduced pricing gained from the school's ability to bulk purchase items.

This scheme operates under the policy and guidelines of the Department of Education (DoE) and is endorsed annually by the school's P&C Association.

I look forward to your support of this scheme, ensuring your students start the day prepared and resourced for the school year ahead.

Summary of Fees

The 2025 SRS fees are broken down into the following sections:

Part A: Includes textbooks, resources, online platforms and programs and general basic resources for all subject areas, applies to all students.

Part B: Includes additional resource materials, equipment and programs to enhance student learning outcomes, for all elective subjects, applies to all year 7 students.

Part C: Includes additional resource materials, equipment and programs to enhance student learning outcomes, for all elective subjects, applies to all year 8 and 9 students.

Part D: Includes additional resource materials, equipment and programs to enhance student learning outcomes; applies to all year 10, 11 and 12 students.

Part E: Includes fees for students enrolled in specific elective subjects – year 11 and 12 only.

Part F: Sporting Academies, Interschool Sport and BAM.

The SRS provides the entire package for the specified participation fee and is not available in part.

Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) Government Contribution

Every eligible student in years 7-12 at Bremer State High School receives financial assistance from the Department of Education to offset the costs of textbooks and resources. This assistance is provided to the school once a year in the form of a Textbook and Resources Allowance (TRA). The school retains this allowance to offset the costs to parents as detailed in the fees area of this document. The SRS invoices you receive will be the full cost of participation in the SRS minus TRA already held by the school.

How do I participate in the Scheme?

Parents and carers wishing to take advantage of the services outlined and agreeing to the conditions therein should complete and return the online SRS Participation Agreement form at enrolment interview. A hard copy of the participation form is available at the school administration office. Payment of the participation fee implies acceptance of the SRS including the Terms and Conditions, irrespective of whether or not the signed form has been returned. Parents are only required to complete the SRS Participation Agreement form once for the duration of their student's enrolment.

Non-Participation

Parents and carers who do not wish to participate in the scheme should complete and tick the non-participation option on the agreement form and return it to the school finance office. These parents and carers will receive a credit from the school to the value of the Government Allowance (TRA) for their child and will be required to provide all necessary textbooks and resources. A list of the text books and resources can be provided by the school to parents and carers. For Items that form part of learning platforms and programs that are unable to be sourced individually, an itemised invoice will be issued by the school.



Payment Plans

Parents requesting a payment plan must have established their payment schedule before end of February 2025 in order to prevent any delay in access to textbooks or resources to their student. Payment Plans can be negotiated according to individual family circumstances and options available include: Centrepay, scheduled bank transfer or direct debit. Non-Payment of Fees

Fees apply to all students and it is essential that they are paid so that resources can be provided to teachers and students in the classroom. Bremer State High School ensures that classrooms are well resourced and to a high standard. This cannot happen without your support.

Students with outstanding fees may be denied the opportunity to participate in non-compulsory school activities. Students will not be provided with resources until outstanding fees from previous year/s have been paid.

As per the terms and conditions of the SRS Participation Agreement signed by parents prior to enrolment:

23. Non-payment of the participation fee by designated payment date(s) may result in debt recovery action in accordance with the Department's Debt Management Procedure. In such cases, the principal may:

- Withdraw the student's participation in the SRS
- Require the return of items provided by the SRS
- Withhold the provision of any further items under the SRS
- Exclude the student from optional, non-curricular activities; and/or
- Initiate debt recovery action

Pro-Rata Refunds

Student/s leaving the school or transferring to another may be entitled to a pro-rata refund of fees paid to the school and the Textbook and Resource Allowance. The pro-rata refund is based on a 40-week school year, and excludes costs of ID card, student planner, online subscriptions, workbooks and the non-refundable confirmation fee. Please contact or email the school finance office to discuss any refunds owing.

Finance Office

Our finance office is located in A Block and can be accessed by entering through the front gate and around the back of the Administration building. The finance office is open for payments on weekdays. Please note that for security reasons, the Department of Education does not permit payment details to be taken over the telephone.



Online Payment

Our school's preferred method of payment is via online payment portal BPoint (details available on individual invoices) or via the QParents or QKr Applications. Parents are encouraged to register onto QParents for access to invoices, report cards, online excursion permissions and more.

Payment Policy

To be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities, student accounts must be current. Students who have outstanding fees will not be eligible to participate in extracurricular events such as, but not limited to, sports gala days, school excursions, semi-formals, formals, study tours and programs of excellence.
